Things to Do and see in Moose Jaw:

Temple Gardens Mineral Spa on Fairford Street just East of Main Street. Soak in the indoor/outdoor pool or take part in some of the Spa treatments. There are several more spas in Moose Jaw as well.

The murals of Moose Jaw; located throughout the downtown area.

The Western Development Museum across Main Street and North from the Heritage Inn.

Moose Jaw has about 70 eating places - there are several within a three minute walk of the Heritage Inn.
